Babul received his Master of Visual Arts from Banaras Hindu University, India, and Bachelor of Fine Arts from Dhaka University, Bangladesh. He specialize in Drawing and Creative Paintings, and studied Digital Media Arts, Web Design, and Communications and Media in UK and Canada. He has sound experience in graphic-web design, illustration, video editing, still and motion photography. He has held seven solo painting exhibition and over thirty group shows in Canada, Germany, United Kingdom, India, and Bangladesh.
